Director's Note

I was recently teaching my acting class and we were discussing Henrik Ibsen. I asked the class, "Does anyone know why Ibsen is considered the 'father of modern drama'?" A young actor looked up and said, "I think it's because he started writing about real people who were going through real things and it made you feel like it was you." And, class dismissed. I don't think I have ever heard it said so simply, and so clearly.

Shedding unlikely plots and oversized characters, Ibsen brought us into regular people's homes and let us in on their secrets and lies, weaknesses and strengths, and struggle for happiness. A Doll's House, considered by many his masterwork, is still one of the most widely produced plays globally, as well as one of the most famous gender political moments in world literature. Ingmar Bergman, the Swedish master filmmaker and theater director, adapted A Doll's House in 1981 to "get to the essence" of the story of a woman with an awakening towards a steady and sober view of reality. Much has been written about Nora and her journey in Ibsen's play and I would never dare to reinvent or redesign what scholars and literary experts have been saying about her since 1879. But my interest in this adaptation, in telling this story, in addition to the obvious, was to explore what Nora feels. And what Torvald feels. What Krogstad and Mrs. Linde and Dr. Rank feel. All five of them are "real" people going through "real" things, each with a very troubled, aching heart. Their struggles, either right or wrong, wise or unwise, are what make us lean in and watch and care.
