Director's Note

I'm always astounded by how messy Shakespeare's plays are; ask any actor who is conscientiously trying to plot a timeline of events, and they'll tell you Shakespeare was either incapable of, or uninterested in that kind of continuity. Distances of thousands of miles are traveled by foot in hours, characters' ages seem to bend and stretch. Cymbeline is messier than most: its plot is a series of twists, surprises and coincidences that border on the ridiculous, and there are so many styles of writing you may wonder if you're in a romance, a comedy, an adventure story or a tragic history. Cymbeline is late in Shakespeare's canon, and I suspect he was having a lot of fun winking at us, and himself; he even inserts sly references and tributes to his own past plays.

Many have remarked on the inappropriateness of the play's title; Cymbeline is by no means the largest role. But I think if you looked for a central thread in this story, you'd say it follows a King who is failing at his job and at his fatherhood, who takes on bad advice, and rejects the very people he should embrace. Without Cymbeline's initial blundering, none of the wide-ranging ensuing events could occur; he himself causes the chaos. And then, as Shakespeare is pulling you back and forth and up and down, you may notice another thread that runs deep throughout. Despite Cymbeline's weaknesses, his citizenry supports him while they resist him. They confide in and complain to the audience about the situation, and they work behind the scenes to do everything they can to correct their leader's misguided course. They don't give up. They constantly work to reestablish order.

I hope you will find yourself one minute agog by the outrageousness of the plot, then in the next, choking up over the beautiful and truthful humanity embedded within. I think these sometimes lightening-speed juxtapositions are purposefully expressing a world that has been turned upside down. To me, Shakespeare skillfully monitors it all, and ends up illuminating the impossible, complicated and sometimes beautiful messiness that is the struggle of life. His audacity is breathtaking.

Born in Stratford-upon-Avon in 1564, he became a central figure of the Elizabethan era. Shakespeare's works, including Romeo and Juliet, Hamlet, and Macbeth, showcase his mastery of language, character, and universal themes. Renowned for both his tragedies and comedies, he penned such beloved plays as Twelfth Night and A Midsummer Night's Dream, blending wit, romance,

and poignant insight. His 154 sonnets and narrative poems further reveal his poetic brilliance. Despite living over four centuries ago, Shakespeare's exploration of human emotion and social complexity remains profoundly relevant, making his legacy unparalleled in the world of theater and literature.
