The Antaeus Company was created in 1991 as a project of the Center Theatre Group. It was co-founded by award-winning actor, playwright, drama scholar and director, Dakin Matthews, who served as its Artistic Director for twelve years. His co-founder was actress, writer, director Lillian Groag. Four years ago Matthews retired as Artistic Director turning over that position to John Apicella and Jeanie Hackett. Their mission is ".....to keep classical theater vibrantly alive in ourselves and in our community,"

In their new interim home at the Deaf West Theatre in North Hollywood, the company is presenting the complete nine one-act plays entitled Tonight At Eight-Thirty by Noel Coward, plus a tenth play never produced before on the West Coast. Four one-acts will be featured in two evenings; the two remaining ones to be presented separately during the run. Two separate casts alternate in the roles led by six different directors.

To date, I have seen Part I, of the four plays, Star Chamber directed by William Ludel, We Were Dancing directed by Michael Murray, The Astonished Heart directed by Stephanie Shroyer and Hands Across the Sea also directed by Michael Murray. All of these plays were performed with perfect British accents. The plays are very humorous, musical and entertaining, just what to expect from Noel Coward. Costume design is by A. Jeffrey Schoenberg, choreography by Kay Cole, musical direction by Matt Goldsby. This is theater at its best! Part II will open Nov. 10, 2007.
