Last fall, we achieved a major accomplishment by producing not one, but two incredible plays developed in the Antaeus Playwrights Lab. This is a milestone we had long hoped to achieve, and we couldn't be more pleased, or more proud, to have shared The Abuelas and Eight Nights with our community.

In February, Directors Armin Shimerman and Elizabeth Swain brought us an unforgettable production of Shakespeare's Measure for Measure, painfully and poignantly resonant in the #MeToo era. And although this production was forced to close just a few weeks into its run, it still made a profound impact on our community. We just wish we could have shared it with more of you.

When the pandemic hit, our staff got to work transitioning programs online, looking for ways to meet this strange and challenging moment, navigating both social distancing and the important national conversation about equity, diversity, and inclusion in the performing arts. And while it hasn't been an easy time, I believe that Antaeus will come through this year stronger and more resilient, with renewed creativity and a deeper commitment to our core values.

None of this would have been possible without the extraordinary support of this community. At a time when so many arts organizations are struggling, we are profoundly grateful to you, our generous donors. Your support has allowed us to continue our work, serving the theater's mission and ensuring that, when all of this is over, we'll be ready to welcome you back.

Antaeus is an actor-driven theater company that explores and produces timely and timeless works, grounded in our passion for the Classics. We illuminate diverse human experiences through performance, training, and outreach.

Over three decades since our founding as a cooperative theater ensemble in 1991, Antaeus has developed a reputation as a highly-trained Company of professional artists with a rare capacity to create complex and timeless works of theater. In early 2017, Antaeus opened the doors to our new home in Downtown Glendale, the Kiki & David Gindler Performing Arts Center. We now present an annual subscription season of four productions, and offer sold-out readings in our Black Box theater year-round. We train and mentor professional actors in our renowned Antaeus Academy, and invest in L.A.'s thriving pool of playwriting talent through our Playwrights Lab.

Although the pandemic has altered our timeline, we're still looking forward to celebrating our 30th Anniversary, now planned for the 2021/22 Season.

2020 & **BEYOND**

When statewide closures went into effect last March, we had to cancel the final four weeks of Measure for Measure, and although we initially hoped to be back in time to open William Saroyan's The Time of Your Life in June, it became apparent within the first few weeks of the shutdown that returning by summer wasn't going to be possible. Now, as we're reaching the end of 2020, the theater has been closed for most of the year.

Our administrative team has been working from home throughout the shutdown, and even in this time of social distancing, Antaeus has been keeping busy, launching new initiatives and community activities. Last May, we premiered a low-cost online Masterclass series, taught by Company members Armin Shimerman and Dakin Matthews. Classes are open to the public and have attracted participants from around the world! We've continued our Playwrights Lab, Antaeus Academy classes, and Company projects online, and although it's beyond the scope of this 2019/20 Annual report, Fall 2020 has already brought exciting new digital theater and fun engagement events to our community.

We would be remiss not to mention that the global pandemic has not been the only event to change our world this year. Last summer, in recognition of the national demand for theaters to adopt proactive anti-racist programming and practices, we launched a series of ongoing EDI (equity, diversity and inclusion) conversations among our Company, staff, and Board. This represents the continuation of ongoing work in this area, directly related to our Strategic Plan and our core values. Recognizing that EDI work at Antaeus is a continual process with many goals, we have hired a professional facilitator to guide these conversations, and we will continue these discussions in 2021 and beyond. We look forward to sharing the insights and artistic developments that come out of this important process with you.

We're extremely grateful to be able to share that, despite the struggles of the last few months, thanks to the incredible generosity of this community, we were able to meet our fundraising goal for the 2019/20 season. Although we face continued challenges in this time of uncertainty, Antaeus is staying strong, and we can promise that we'll be ready to open our doors when this unplanned intermission finally comes to an end.





CLASSIC SUNDAYS

This signature monthly reading series of the most beloved classics in the theater canon ran from September through February of the 2019/20 Season, before the theater closed due to the pandemic. Classic Sundays is generously sponsored in part by Debra Thompson & Lawrence Riff, and The Peter Glenville Foundation.

LAB RESULTS

The Playwrights Lab supports a select group of writers as they develop the classic plays of the future. In January 2020, we presented our second annual *LAB RESULTS* Festival over two sold-out weekends.



THE MADRES

It's 1978 in Buenos Aires; people are disappearing and no one is talking about it. On November 23, 2019 Antaeus hosted a special reading of *The Madres*, followed by a talkback with playwright Stephanie Alison Walker, joined by Nestor Fantini, Argentine activist and former political prisoner.



METAMORPHOSES

As part of LA Opera's *Eurydice Found* Festival, on January 31, 2020, Antaeus presented a free public reading of *Metamorphoses*, followed by a talkback with Tony Award-winning director and playwright, Mary Zimmerman, led by Antaeus Artistic Director, Kitty Swink.



ARTS EDUCATION

The Antaeus Odyssey Artists' Workshop serves students at four partner sites, William Tell Aggeler Opportunity High School (in cooperation with Rancho San Antonio Boys Home), The New Village Girls Academy, Herbert Hoover High School, and Homeboy Industries. Participants often have a history of trauma, and for many this is the first time they have been given a platform and encouraged to pursue creative self-expression.

Using an adaptive curriculum pairing Shakespeare with hip-hop and contemporary poetry, the text is a jumping off point for students to analyze themes that resonate with their own lives. Writing, speaking, and improvisation exercises allow students to experience the power of working as an ensemble. Students learn greater empathy for one another, and are empowered to find their own voices and speak their truth.

Although our Arts Education activities had to be paused in spring 2020, our Teaching Artists have been developing strategies with partner sites, and making plans to resume their work in 2021.

ANTAEUS ACADEMY

In our renowned Academy, skilled pedagogues and celebrated working actors provide high-level training for both aspiring theater artists honing essential skills and seasoned professionals fine-tuning their craft. Classes are offered in three sessions running year-round, and have continued online through the pandemic, with timely offerings including "Acting and Auditioning Online: During & After COVID" and "Dynamic Auditions in the Digital Age."

"I didn't realize that I had the power to do Shakespeare. As an African-American girl, I used to think that kind of theatre and speech wasn't for me, that I wasn't included, but I am. And I can. What's going on inside of me, going on in our world, Shakespeare was writing about THAT, and that means I can really do it."

"I didn't realize that Shakespeare is poetry and that it has rhythm, that it's like hip-hop, that it's like dance, that it's like singing. I get to use all of me, and there's not many places or spaces in regular education that you get to do that anymore."

NEW CLASSICS INITIATIVE

As an artist-driven theater company, we believe in the power and importance of storytellers. They are architects of culture and windows to our history. Great theater demands a multiplicity of voices sharing vast and varying ideas and perspectives. The purpose of our New Classics Initiative is to nurture an inclusive generation of writers, both through our Playwrights Lab – a creative incubator for writers in the LA theater scene - and through a newly developed commissioning program we'll be announcing and launching in 2021. Through these programs, we support the creation of extraordinary new plays that will stand the test of time.

We've seen exceptional new work flourish in the supportive environment of our Playwrights Lab, and when we debuted productions of two new plays from the Lab last fall, it was a moment of great pride for our company. Through this process, we experienced firsthand the power of programming dynamic new voices alongside celebrated classics - a combination that contrasts and enhances the impact of both.

We are proud to consider "new classics" a central part of our artistic identity. By supporting the great storytellers of our own time, we are not only creating something of value for the Antaeus community; we are fostering the development of extraordinary art to enrich the wider world of theater for generations to come.

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The mission and programming at Antaeus are driven by a belief that theater changes lives and communities for the better. Antaeus is more than the award-winning work seen on our stage. In addition to engaging students in the classroom, we seek to create educational opportunities for people of all ages, including talkbacks and post-show discussions. Antaeus welcomes a diverse audience from across the greater Los Angeles area, with typical annual attendance of approximately 10,000. As an anchor of Downtown Glendale's Art and Entertainment District, we have built strong relationships with the City of Glendale, Glendale Unified School District, and the Armenian Dramatic Arts Alliance, to help us better engage and reflect our neighborhood.

We work to build community by increasing access through ticket subsidy programs, with an emphasis on serving our immediate local community and welcoming constituents of all backgrounds. We are deeply committed to the values of cultural equity and inclusion, and 35% of tickets are offered to community members for free, or at a reduced cost, in order to break down barriers normally associated with theater attendance.

Although our doors have been closed for much of 2020, we are continuing our commitment to community engagement by offering free and low-cost programs online.
